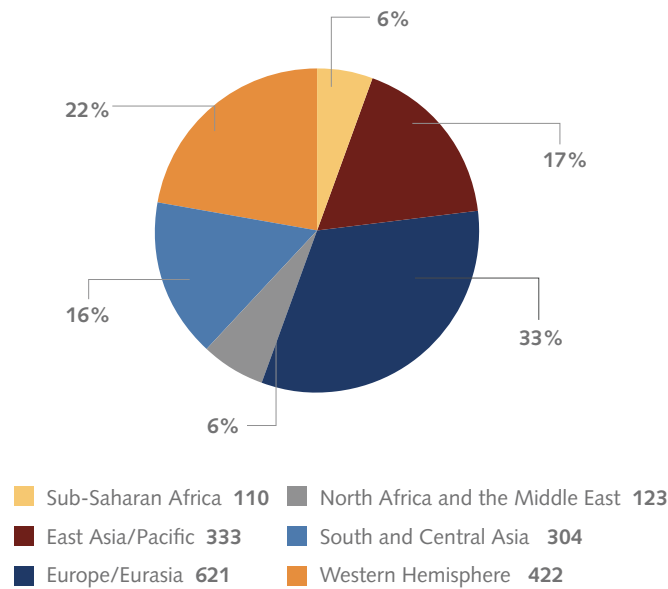

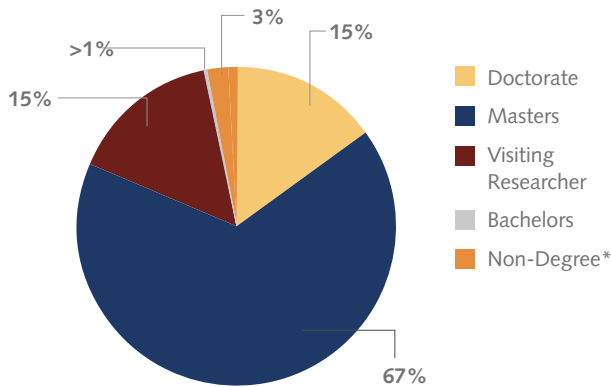

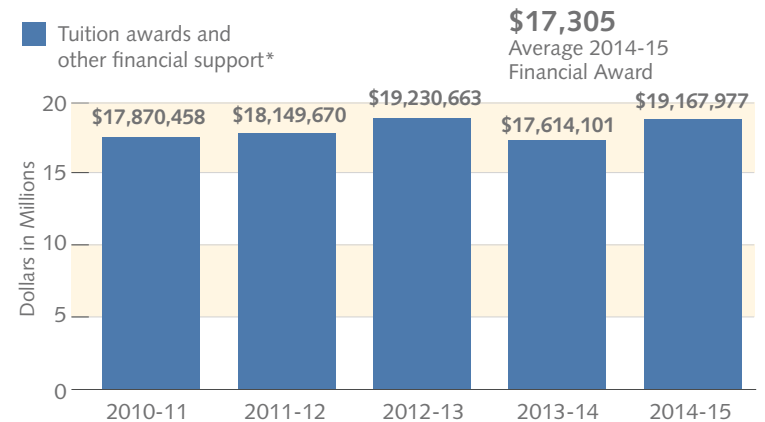

Fulbright Foreign Student Highlights

- In 2014-15, over 4,100 students, including 1,913 new students, are participating in the Fulbright Foreign Student Program at over 378 institutions located in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. The gender breakdown for the 2014 cohort is 48 percent female and 52 percent male.
- A priority of the Fulbright Program is to encourage the participation of students from non-traditional backgrounds who display leadership and academic potential. The U.S. Department of State funds intensive English training for grantees who need to improve their language skills in order to participate in the Program.
- In 2014, the Foreign Language Teaching Assistant Program (FLTA), a component of the Fulbright Student Program, supported 413 participants representing 51 countries and teaching 33 different languages at 215 institutions across the United States.
- The Fulbright Program provides orientation and enrichment opportunities to enhance the Fulbright Program experience in the United States.
 - > More than half of all incoming Fulbright Foreign Students participate in pre-academic training, either English language training or Fulbright Gateway Orientations.
 - > Enrichment Seminars are organized in 16 different cities across the United States.
 - > Grantees also participate in specialized workshops with themes, such as From Lab to Market, focusing on research and entrepreneurship, U.S. Disability Rights and Global Health Innovations.
- Program funding is provided by the U.S. Congress through an annual appropriation to the U.S. Department of State. Foreign governments, colleges and universities and private foundations also provide direct and indirect support.
