PROGRAM BENEFITS

Fulbright FTLAs:

- ★ Pay no fees for the TOEFL test
- ★ Receive a travel and relocation allowance of €2,000
- ★ Receive a combination of stipends and grants from host university and Fulbright Austria (minimum value: \$17,000)
- ★ Receive health benefits sponsored by the US government
- ★ Pay no tuition to attend two courses per semester
- ★ Gain valuable first-hand experience teaching German as a foreign language
- ★ Participate in enrichment activities
- ★ Join a national and global network of Fulbright alums



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IS FULBRIGHT RIGHT FOR ME?

Eligible applicants must meet the following requirements:

- ★ Austrian citizenship (dual citizens of Austria and the US are not eligible)
- ★ Bachelor's degree or higher (you can also apply if you are in the final year of a bachelor's program and will have your degree in the summer prior to starting the FLTA program)
- ★ strong English skills

A background in teaching is not a requirement for the FLTA program; whether you're augmenting existing teaching experience or gaining your first practical experience in a classroom, this program will help you achieve your goals.

WHAT'S THE TIMELINE?

15 OCTOBER–15 NOVEMBER apply to the program

EARLY DECEMBER selection interviews

LATE DECEMBER first selection round; selected applications submitted to host universities for review

JANUARY–MARCH host universities make selections, and selected applicants receive placement offers

APRIL preparation begins with host university

JUNE attend Fulbright Austria pre-departure orientation

JULY complete visa process

AUGUST depart for the US

Founded in 1946, the Fulbright Program is named after J. William Fulbright (1905–1995) who was instrumental in creating a program that aims to cultivate “perceptions and perspectives that transcend national boundaries.” Initially, the program sold surplus war property overseas to finance an unprecedented number of bilateral educational and cultural exchanges for students, scholars, and teachers. Today, the Fulbright Program facilitates these bilateral exchanges between the US and 155 countries around the globe. Fulbright Austria was founded in 1951, making it one of the oldest Fulbright commissions in the world.

WHERE CAN I TEACH AND STUDY?


