16:30 Austria and Europe: Politics and Populism, Migration and Memory

A panel discussion and Q & A moderated by Dr. Lonnie JOHNSON with

Dr. Thomas KÖNIG, Vienna Institute of Advanced Studies, Senior Researcher, Political Science

Thomas König is a social scientist specializing on the relationship of science and politics. Besides several other academic publications, he published two books, one on the early history of the Fulbright Program and its impact on post-war Austrian academia (published 2012 in German with StudienVerlag, Innsbruck), and the other on European research policy, tracing the establishment of the European Research Council (published 2017 in English with Polity, Cambridge UK). Thomas has held positions both in academia and in policy-making; in 2014, he was a Fulbright Scholar at Harvard University. Currently, he works as strategic advisor to the director of the Institute for Advanced Studies, Vienna.

Dr. Heidemarie UHL, Institute of Culture Studies and Theatre History, Austrian Academy of Sciences

Heidemarie Uhl is a senior researcher at the Austrian Academy of Sciences in Vienna and lecturer at the University of Vienna and the University of Graz. She holds a PhD in Contemporary History from the University of Graz and has published extensively on contemporary Austrian and European history and historiography. She was a research fellow at the IFK (Internationales Forschungszentrum Kulturwissenschaften Vienna) and the Berliner Kolleg für Vergleichende Geschichte Europas. She was a guest professor at Strasbourg University, Hebrew University Jerusalem, Strasbourg University, AUB Andrassy University Budapest and Stanford University. Uhl is a member of the Austrian Delegation to the IHRA International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance and member of the scientific board of the Haus der Geschichte Österreich (vice chairperson), the Militärhistorische Denkmalkommission at the Austrian Ministry of Defence (vice chairperson) and the Fachkommission der Stiftung Brandenburgische Gedenkstätten. She is member of the editorial board of Zeitgeschichte and of Contemporary Austrian Studies. She is currently directing the project Neugestaltung des Österreichischen Heldendenkmals in Vienna (Reconceptualisation of the Austrian Hero's Monument) on Heldenplatz.

11:00 Transatlantic Relations: Austria, the United States, and the European Union Acting DCM Stephen A, Hubler, U.S. Embassy Vienna Acting DCM Stephen Hubler has served as Counselor for Political and Economic Affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Vienna since August 2016. Before that, he served as the Senior Coordinator for Refugee and Internally Displaced Persons Affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Baghdad from 2015-2016. Additional postings have included Consul General at the U.S. Consulate General in Düsseldorf, Germany; Deputy Principal Officer at the U.S. Consulate General in

St. Petersburg, Russia; Political-Economic Affairs Counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Skopje, Macedonia; Regional Refugee Coordinator for the Horn of Africa, working out of the U.S. Embassy in Addis Ababa; as well as several postings in Washington DC, San Jose, and Frankfurt. Prior to joining the Foreign Service, Steve was a U.S. Army Officer with the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment based in Fulda, Germany.
